- Re-emphasize what is a BOCES and how they work
  - Mission is to emphasize cooperation and economic efficiency
  - In NYS 65 years
  - 712 Districts are members of BOCES
    - 5 city school districts not eligible
  - Over 30 states emulate BOCES
  - Service is created when 2 or more districts need similar programs called Cooperative Service (Co-ser)
  - All BOCES programs are aid-able 36% for Onteora
  - BOCES are non-profit each Co-ser has own budget and money left-over is returned to District
  - No taxing authority revenue from Districts' participation
  - Unit prices will be sent in Jan. to District
    - Preliminary service request due to BOCES in Feb.
      - Non-binding
    - Final is due 5/1/13 by law
      - Binding
- District (BOCES) Superintendent works for Commissioner representative of Ulster county
  - Meets with Albany representatives to get answers for Superintendents
  - Salary has been frozen for a number of years
- Solar car team- 6 students and 3 teachers year
  - long project involving many students
  - 2 students from Onteora
  - $\circ$  Built car and raced from Texas to CA came in 1<sup>st</sup> in our division
  - Drive through LA in traffic people took pictures of car

  - o 7 year program
  - Open in Sept. 2014
  - Virtual Program Grant
    - 14 Onteora students taking AP courses using virtually learning
      - More than ½ Ulster program

- Pre- University Robotics
  - Very successful
- Science research and experimental design
- Audio engineering and music studio production
  - o Not all musicians
- Health occupations program based in Kingston and new one in Ellenville
- Career and Tech Light for Alt Ed students

- Morning in Alt Ed and afternoon exploratory in Career Tech to get job skills to build confidence and willingness to participate
- Establishing a program marrying robotics and welding
  - Robotics is the future of the welding field
    - Program in OH visited and partnering
  - o In Sept 2014

- Special Education some require extensive services, pull kids together from the county

- Alternative Ed Career Tech Light, Career & Tech
- Instructional services- Professional Development
- Center for School Safety
- Bilingual education
- Mid Hudson Regional Information Center (RIC)- data warehouse

Discussion

- Always looking for space- West Hurley School
  - Mostly looking for one room
  - would have to be a convenient location for more than one District
- Vision of BOCES and centralization (regional HS)
  - o Legislation in Albany not picked up enough momentum
  - Means taking home rules away from District
  - Enrollment in Ulster is declining- not stabilizing
    - Take 8 HS look at a magnet approach
      - 1<sup>st</sup> 2 years common, next 2 years specialize
    - Keeps home rule, and gives more learning opportunities

- Provide students with best, most efficient education
- P-Tech program designed only for a particular student
  - Grant was written to target non-college bound student
    - Does not mean we have to exclusively omit college bound students, but need to seek them out for the grant
    - 4 counties 3,600 square miles, very different than Brooklyn
    - Challenge of transportation, site location
    - Newburgh received same amount as Ulster BOCES (\$400,000)
    - o State awarded more grants than funded
      - Had to reduce by 5%
    - Districts pay tuition (\$10,000 per student)
      - Still have same operation cost, just add to budget
      - Working with State Ed to make tuition charge aid-able
      - Offer as extension of Alt Ed Co-ser would be aid-able
  - Tech Valley has empty seats because District's tuition is not aid-able
- Calendar discussions to start secondary school at later hour and Feb winter break
  - o 8 calendars in the county
  - o Operate BOCES programs when cooperating districts are in school
  - New Paltz is only district off in Feb.
  - Will discuss with 8 Superintendents, but very difficult all run different types of schedules
  - o Raised to Superintendents about starting later, no one wants
  - Research shows HS students do better with a later start
  - o 2020 Symposium about timing of school day for HS
    - Will take a few years, but a group will be following up on it
  - Can't unilaterally change time because of BOCES issues
  - If Districts move, BOCES will start later
  - Great topic for UC school Board
    - Ann will bring up at next UCSBA meeting
- 6.02 Transportation Director, Nicole Sommer will update the Board on the Bid Process for Transportation Contract (proposed 7:00 duration 10 min)

District and Mr. Walsh from Transportation Advisory Services (TAS) have worked closely to create a timeline of the bid process New Contract:

- 5 separate contracts
  - Opens the doors for more bidders, separates summer special education and regular for State Ed Reporting
- 5 Year Contract
  - Allows new bidders who are making substantial bus purchases to amortize over longer period and fixed pricing per year
- Price "caps" on trips and summer
  - Trip rates are capped at 70% of basic contract rates.
- Summer cannot exceed school year rates
  - Helps to controls unreasonable pricing from summer contractors given award process in NY

- Increase bid response.
- A bus scheduled for a half day gets paid 65% since they have the same capital costs
  - o Rarely happens
- Excess hourly rate be in effect on anrRuns over 6 hours
- Differentiated Trip Pricing
  - Potential savings for the District.
- Differentiated vehicle pricing for different size vehicles
- Split Schedule Pricing -minimum of 1hour for each run
- Late runs billed at excess hourly rate hourly rate
   Potential savings for the district
- Additional Liquidated damages requiring performance
- DVR Camera system 3 camera's per large bus.
  - Checking behaviors of students and drivers management.

- Share transportation with other Districts
  - Piggy backing not allowed in transportation
  - o Investigate other ways to share transportation with other Districts
- Videos on buses
  - Policy 5751 Video Cameras
    - More explicit policy as to for what disciplinary action
      - Need more student awareness about cameras
    - Cameras are not monitored
    - Policy only addresses student behavior, not driver issues
      - ONTEA contract allows for viewing of videos
  - Amount of incidents on school buses needing viewing video is very small, much more on accidents
  - Cost will be passed onto District spend money on security wisely
  - Great tool for accidents and illegal activity by drivers
  - Industry standard to have 3 cameras on each bus
  - See benefits of student management using videos through data
  - Able to prove accusations of student to student or student to driver
    - Can helps to resolve issues, before discipline
    - See log of viewing tapes and for what reasons RFI from last meeting
    - PBIS schools instill positive behavior needs to include bus drivers
    - Camera can be seen as an invaluable tool in unforeseen circumstances instead of an assumption of guilt
      - Simple as an irate parent due to the child's perception of driver video can prove
    - 3 cameras on buses:

- 1 behind driver over shoulder what driver is doing, students boarding bus
- Top pointing toward aisles
- Back four last rows
- GPS- speed, stops and where they are on their route
- Can be changed before this goes out for bids
- Timeline seems too tight
  - Can issue addendums even following 1/6/14 date
  - Next Board agenda is enough time
    - Push timeline out 2 weeks
  - Buses that distribute WiFi allow students to use technology for schoolwork o Ms. Sommer to investigate
- Where are camera signs in HS? Are students aware?
- 5 year contract seems long
  - TAS is recommending
  - o Items in contract protect performance and prices
  - o If contractors have to make bus purchases, 5 year will be enticing
  - Can feedback from contractors be sent to Board
- Put on next agenda with Mark Walsh present
- See more information as well see more of the documentation
- RFI see bus incidents report

Assistant Superintendent for Business Victoria McLaren asked for feedback from Board for budget parameters

- Budget is increasing over \$2 million
  - strictly roll over preliminary number
  - Can whittle down
- Tax levy assuming 2% CPI \$700,000 increase without exclusions (TRA contributions)
  - o CPI may be very low this year
- What tax levy increase would they Board like to see?
  - Have done 0% in last few years
  - Have allowable increase, no matter how small
  - 1% = \$400,000
  - Last year allowable was 3.32% because of carryover from year before
    - Carryover what was not used from based levy limit from one year to another
    - Should be similar this year
- Put best value on table listen to BOCES offerings
  - Figure out what we need to do and then budget to set the levy
