Dear Onteora Families,

We remain committed to sharing information with our school community and I need to share an update related to positive COVID cases within our District. We have been notified of two additional individuals having tested positive.

Today, we were notified of another positive case within our HS community. This individual has not been in the building since November 20th, and no further quarantine is necessary based on the specifics of this situation. We were also notified of an individual from our Bennett Elementary community having tested positive. This individual is fully remote.

We continue to work with the Ulster County Department of Health (UCDOH), and as new information arises, we will keep everyone informed.

As the positive cases continue to rise within our County, we are monitoring the situation on a daily basis. At this time, we will remain in our remote learning model through Friday, December 11th, but we will review the situation as it progresses and if we need to adjust our plans, we will do so without hesitation. I anticipate that areas within our County may be deemed a "yellow zone" in the coming days. Schools within a yellow zone are required to implement a testing protocol in order to remain in the in person learning environment. We do not currently have the resources necessary to implement a testing protocol, but I will provide additional information once we receive guidance from the UCDOH.
