

### Considerations and Next Steps for Welcoming 6th Grade to the Onteora Middle School

### 2010 - 2011 Middle School Task Force

#### Reviewed the following configurations:

- » K-8 in all three elementary schools
- » 5-8 in MS/HS
- » 5-8 in Bennett
- » 6-8 in Bennett
- » 6-8 in MS/HS
- » 7-8 in MS/HS
- » 7-12 as Jr./Sr. HS
- » 7-9 MS in MS/HS

The recommendation of the Task Force was to create a 6-8 Middle School in the MS/HS





On February 28, 2012, the Board voted to restructure the elementary buildings from three K-6 buildings to two K -3 buildings and one 4 - 6 grade building. This restructure was completed for the opening of school in September of 2012.

No change was made to the structure of the middle school.

This action addressed some of the issues related to declining enrollment, but no action was taken on the recommendation to expand the middle school grade configuration.



# The Board of Education adopted the following goal for the 2022-2023 school year:

Support the development of the District's long-term, district-wide plan that addresses current challenges and opportunities that have already been identified, including declining enrollment, staff shortages, facilities needs, budget, student achievement, community impact, and the expansion of the middle school to add sixth graders. The Board acknowledges that additional challenges and opportunities will likely be discovered throughout the exploration process. The Board aims to accomplish this through input from the Superintendent, a Board ad hoc committee, the Shared Decision-Making committee, PTA's as well as clear and consistent community outreach. In the next year, the Board plans to accomplish: Forming a Board ad hoc committee, holding at least one public meeting to discuss the District's long-term plan, reviewing the Building Utilization and Grade Configuration Study by Dr. Kevin S. Baughman, and requesting at least one progress report from the Superintendent.



The goal contains multiple components:

- 1. Creation of a long-term plan
- 2. Expansion of the middle school to include 6th grade
- 3. Forming a Board Ad Hoc Committee
- 4. Holding at least one public meeting to discuss the long-term plan
- 5. Review of the Building Utilization and Grade Configuration Study by Dr. Kevin Baughman





Moving 6th grade is one component of the Board goal. It will have its own implementation process and will be unique to the students, staff and buildings most involved. The student, parent, and staff engagement will be separate and focused on the particular needs and opportunities inherent to the incorporation of the 6th grade into the middle school.

Once the specific cohort has been identified, collaboration and implementation will begin.





# Benefits of incorporating sixth grade into the middle school:

- The 6-8 model allows students to develop a greater sense of affiliation with the school and staff. Students will have more time to build lasting relationships at a critical time in development. In addition, academically a 6-8 staff will have more time to identify, assess and implement supports and interventions.
- This model enhances the efficiency and effectiveness of curricular articulation and staff communication. NYS Standards are often grouped grades 6-8. Academically, 6th grade is generally seen as secondary content.
- The 6-8 model allows for the potential expansion of the PLC model and co-teaching models, working vertically and horizontally to discuss student success and challenges, reflect on professional practice, adapt instructional models, and work collaboratively by content area to strengthen our instructional models.



# Benefits of incorporating sixth grade into the middle school (continued):

- For students with IEP's and those who have related services, there is great difficulty when they come to middle school to find opportunities for electives and required classes such as chorus or band. A move for 6th grade would allow more opportunities for students to earn these required course credits and give more flexibility in their schedule
- The middle school teaching model allows more flexibility and time in what and when students access required classes. NYS recognizes 6-8 configuration; languages, technology, home and careers, music, art, and health can be spread out over three years. Limited staff resources with certain certifications limit what can be provided at Bennett.
- This is time sensitive in order to provide the necessary supports and services to our students as they deal with the effects of the pandemic. They deserve to have the additional time to access all the resources that can be made available during middle school with the additional year.

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Special Education Supports:

- » Continuum of support for sixth grade similar to current model
- Continued Professional Development
  opportunities for Special Education teachers in the areas of multi-sensory reading, math, and co-teaching implementation
- » Close collaboration with related service providers
- » AIS and MTSS Support



#### <u>Once a date is determined for the movement of 6th grade to the</u> <u>MS, we will begin to engage in the following actions as a staff:</u>

- » engage with the 6th grade and middle school faculty on program design and implementation concerns
- » meet with the 5th grade (this year's cohort or next) parents to discuss plans for engaging students in a developmentally appropriate learning environment that offers robust learning and extracurricular opportunities and to address and incorporate concerns into our planning
- » utilize space and scheduling to enhance appropriate separation between 6th graders and high school students as recommended by Dr. Baughman
- » meet with 5th grade students(this year's cohort or next) to hear their suggestions and concerns, as well as to preview some things to be excited about as they transition to the middle school
- refine structure and support for the social emotional transition for students and families

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**Transportation Grouping:** 

MS students will continue to ride the bus with HS students. The late buses from the MS/HS also transport the Bennett Elementary students that stay for after school activities. Currently we transport students in grades 4-12 together and have been doing so for years.

» Bennett building staff have always insured a special experience for our students as they transition to the middle school. They will continue to work together to make sure that each grade level that moves to the middle school will be recognized and have a chance to participate in this important tradition.





District and building staff will work together to adjust the use of space in the MS/HS building to support the identity and developmental stages of grades six through eight (6-8) as per the recommendation by Dr. Baughman.

There is no expectation that class sizes will increase.
