What are CRRSA & ARP?

The District has been awarded \$2,176,742 and \$4,892,190 through the CRRSA and ARP Acts. This additional funding is to help meet a wide range of needs arising from the COVID-19 Pandemic including reopening school safely for inperson instruction, sustaining safe operations, addressing students' social, emotional, and mental health and academic needs resulting from the pandemic. This funding is for multiple years. When developing the spending plan, the District initially prioritized non-recurring costs. The plan was developed for the use of the Federal grants may change over the next 3-4 years based on the needs of our students.


