DISTRICT NEWS

Assistant Superintendent Deborah Fox announced that:

• The 22nd DECA Annual Toys for OCS Tots Telethon was a huge success. Despite rescheduling, most of the acts were able to come on December 8th. The fine music departments at Onteora provided the backbone of the telethon. Mrs. Cayea, Mrs. Paetow, Mr Murphy and Mrs. Blum all brought their groups. Over 150 students from the Onteora District will benefit from this event with toys, food, clothing and more. Special thanks went to Colleen MacDaniel and her nursing staff, Mrs. Burkhardt and Mrs. Rosato's Honor Society students for making this drive so successful. Also, special thanks went to the Woodstock Fire Department and Woodstock Police Benevolent Association for

- "adopting" Woodstock families and to all the staff members that "adopted" a family to buy gifts for.
- The Coats for Kids drive benefited 54 students.
- DECA hosted a Make A Difference Day drive for items of personal hygiene that were distributed to Family and other shelters.
- Nicole Holmquist, Life Skills teacher, received a \$700 grant for the "Senior Prom" Project from Mid-Hudson Service Learning Institute for Watershed and Environmental Studies "Learn and Serve America Program".
- It is the recommendation of the Superintendent and the Athletic Director that we cancel Varsity Football for the 2007 season in order to continue the progress of rebuilding the program. This decision needed to be made by December 15th in order for the league to begin scheduling.
- The Middle School has been collecting non-perishable foods for a "Stuff the Bus" campaign. All homerooms are feverishly collecting food and we will literally stuff one of our own buses to deliver the food to Family of Woodstock. The whole school will participate in this exciting event.
- The Middle School has assemblies to introduce the new "Battle of the Books" program. Students will form teams of four and devise strategies to become experts on 18 books that have been pre-selected by the committee. The teams will then compete in jeopardy-like competitions until there are the final four. A nighttime competition will be held in the spring with PTSO, parents, teachers, etc. as the audience. Great prizes will be awarded.
- Special thanks to Christine Downs, our School Lunch Manager, for coordinating the Thanksgiving Luncheons at the elementary schools for our Senior Citizens on November 16 and for helping get food and trimmings donated.
- The Phoenicia PTA held a "New, Gently Used, Gently Worn Sale and Coat Giveaway" on Saturday, December 9. The proceeds of the sale will benefit the PTA's Holiday Cheer Drive, which contributes locally to children and families in need in partnership with the Phoenicia staff's Annual Enhanced Toys for Tots Drive and helps many Phoenicia families enjoy an extra special Holiday season.
- The Phoenicia Head Start children will be enjoying a Library Story Hour and Sing-a-Long at Phoenicia Elementary School complete with cookies and milk. Before they return to their classroom and "settle down for a long afternoon's nap", every child will get to select a new pair of mittens or a hat from the Mitten and Hat Tree.
- Last Friday, December 8, was our Staff Development Program on Cyber Security for Youths. Mark Hoops, Sr. Consumer Fraud Representative from the Attorney General's office was the keynote speaker. Investigator Dan Bien from the New York State Troopers Cyber Security Unit, presented, as well as staff from Ulster BOCES Model Schools Program. The District PTA Council is considering hosting a parent information night on the topic later this year.
- The District newsletter was mailed last week and featured our nursing staff, among other excellent District programs and personnel.
- We have again received recognition from New York State Public Relations Association for our District newsletter.
- Holiday concerts are underway beginning Wednesday, December 13 at

the High School for the Chorus and Orchestra, Thursday, December 14 at Woodstock, Monday, December 18 at Phoenicia, and Tuesday, December 19, at Bennett, and Wednesday, December 20 at the High School for the Band and Ensembles. The Middle School concerts will be held in January.

Trustee O'Connor shared the good news that the Kingston Area Football League has accepted Onteora into their league so that we are now able to field a tackle football team starting from ages 8-13. They will practice here in our area. They hope to have the program running by mid-August.

REPORT FROM 2005-2006 STUDENT BOARD REPRESENTATIVE Student Representative Frances Barlow reported:

- On Friday, December 15, the senior class is hosting the seniors vs. staff volleyball game
- The National Honor Society is also raising money for Toys for Tots with Family of Woodstock to create boxes for teens.

- Tobe Carey spoke about the new district master plan with regard to environmental and energy concerns.
- Meg Carey spoke about the capital improvement project and requested that a K-8 school configuration be explored as an option.

REPORTS/ PRESENTATIONS

- Audit Committee Report Trustee Bernholz reported that the Committee met on December 5 and the Internal Auditor reported that the transition with the Claims Auditor and Internal Auditor is going well and there was a need for the establishment of procedures in our treasurer's office and throughout the District. The Internal Auditor is going to report back to us with a risk assessment matrix. The recommendation given to the Audit Committee is that the day-to-day activity has slowed down so that there is a need for a part-time person to alleviate the backlog. This would be a temporary position supported by the pay scale savings that exist in the change of the treasurer. Assistant Superintendent Victoria McLaren reported that the solution has been to provide a temporary clerical substitute a couple of days per week to assist with the office duties. Trustee Bernholz announced that the next meeting will be in early January.
- Communications Committee Trustee O'Connor reported that during the last meeting Vicky Chessler, school paper coordinator spoke about her needs. She does not get much support in publishing the paper. We are looking into what can be used at school and if there is a budget for this and we want to determine if there is an interest among the English department teachers to bring back the journalism class to do the paper.
- Facilities Committee Trustee D'Orazio attended the last meeting
 where they discussed the best way to use the Excel Aid funds for
 expanding our children's education and learning. There is over
 \$660,000 available if we meet certain criteria. The Committee will
 recommend to the Board that some things be done to spend this
 money. It still requires further approval. It will have no impact on

> taxes. Doing improvements and renovations to the High School auditorium which is a gathering place servicing the whole community. Also other facilities improvements in the District. Voters will be asked to approve a project using the Excel Aid funds. The Committee also worked on prioritizing facility needs. The next meeting will be early in January.

- Policy Committee Trustee O'Connor reported that the next meeting will be on January 8.
- Technology Committee Trustee Vanacore reported that the Committee met and went over projections for the next budget to carry forth replacement of computers. Technology infrastructure might also be part of the Excel Aid request. The next meeting will be on January 8 at 2:30 p.m.
- Early Childhood Committee Trustee Vanacore reported that the next meeting is scheduled for Monday, December 18, at 4:00 p.m.
- Wellness Committee Report on Life Skills and Life Sports Robin Sears reported on the history of this committee and the effect of their recommendations from the nutrition committee that have all been implemented very successfully. A movie created by students showing the Wellness Committee's accomplishments was shown. The climbing wall shown was purchased through fund raising efforts of the Middle School. The sub-committee's new recommendations are:
 - 1) That a link to wellness projects/initiatives/information be provided on the District's web page
 - 2) That additional funding be budgeted for the District's food service program for the 2007-2008 school year
 - 3) That the number and frequency of after school, elementary recreation programs be increased
 - 4) That this sub-committee continue in its charge

OLD BUSINESS

- Update on the up-coming Half Day Staff Development days Deborah Fox reported that this is scheduled for January 12 and teachers will be working in buildings to analyze student data to identify longitudinal trends, strengths, and gaps in student performance. This will roll out the work for the February, March and April Staff Development days. The elementary principals and Ms. Fox have recently been trained by staff at Ulster BOCES in a very good method of looking at our data and we analyzed our ELA and Math State assessments from 2003 through 2006 and we are going to have the teachers then learn how to look at this process to inform instruction.
- Enrollment Information Victoria McLaren reported that the prior versions of the FACTS enrollment projection reports compared to our actual enrollments were included in your packets. It can be seen that they are trending together in a downward direction. We are trying to work out in the central office the reasons for the students departing our District with the monthly enrollment report to the Board.
