2021-22 Proposed Budget

- 2020-2021 Budget \$57,938,542
- 2021-2022 Budget \$58,786,143
- Increase of \$847,601 or 1.46%
- Additional Proposition for Capital Project
 - Establish Capital Reserve
- Appropriated Fund Balance
 - \$2,025,000- Appropriated Fund Balance to reduce tax levy
 - \$750,000 Fund Balance to offset additional Capital work



Items included in 2021-2022 Budget

- » Continues all pre-pandemic programs
- » Expands active learning space initiative
- » Increases summer school funding to address academic supports needed following the 2020-2021 school year
- » Increases afterschool homework & supervision
- » Allocates additional funds for mental health support
- » Equipment requests
 - > Transportation Van
 - > Pickup Truck
 - > Mower
 - > Floor Scrubber





Items included in 2021-2022 Budget

- > Health Insurance
 - + Blue Cross/Blue Shield reduced by 1.01%
 - + CDPHP increased by 0.8%
 - + MVP increased by 1%
- > Addition of a 1.0 FTE at Bennett Elementary
 - + Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) for Social Studies
- > Addition of a .6FTE HS Science Teacher
 - + To allow the HS to offer courses based on student need and graduation requirements
- > Increase in District vehicle expenditure lines
 - + Additional funds to support potential purchase of higher cost District vehicles with non-combustion engines







Proposed 2021-22 Levy

Current Year 2020-2021 Levy \$44,758,538

Maximum Proposed 2021-2022 Levy \$45,557,126

Increase of \$798,588 or 1.78%



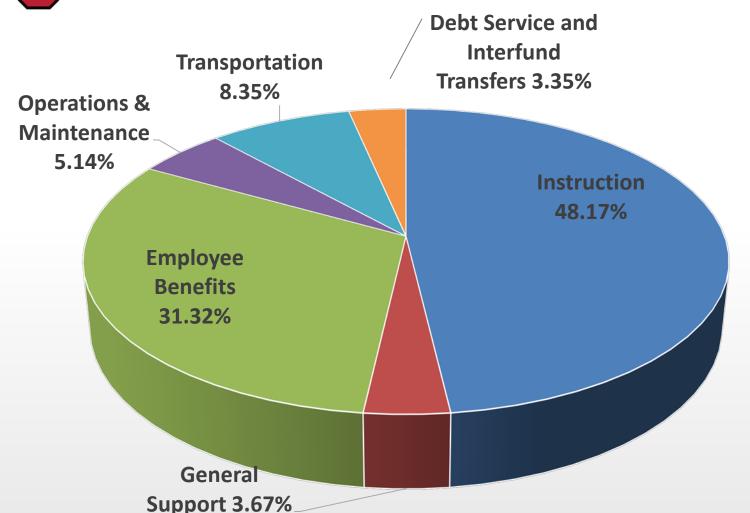


State Aid Projections

 - If State Aid is decreased in state budget, recommend increasing Appropriated Fund Balance



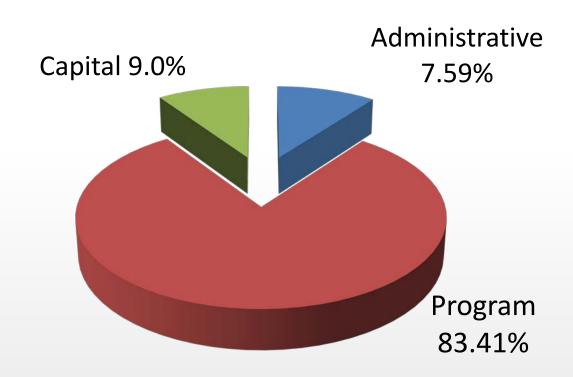
Budget Components (%)

Ballot Items

- » Proposition #1
 - > \$58,786,143 Expenditure Budget
- » Proposition #2
 - > Allow the District to establish a 2021 Capital Reserve Fund in the ultimate amount of \$10 million over a period not to exceed 10 years



Contingency Budget

District can resubmit the same budget, a different budget or go to a contingent budget.

A second budget vote would be held on June 15, 2021.

If a budget is defeated a second time, then the District would be required to go to a contingency budget.

In a contingent budget, the 21-22 tax levy would remain at the same level as the 20-21 school year.

Other contingency rules would apply:

No purchase of equipment

-\$279,500 in recommended budget

Administrative Component Cap

Fees must be charged for Facilities Use

21-22 Tax Levy	\$45,557,126
20-21 Tax Levy	\$44,758,538
21-22 Tax Levy at Contingency	\$44,758,538
Difference between Tax Levy Limit and Contingency	(\$798,588) *

^{*} If contingency occurs, the District could Increase fund balance to offset the reduction of tax levy





Budget Timeline

April 6, 2021 Board of Education Budget Adoption

May 4, 2021 Public Hearing at Board of Education

May 18, 2021 Budget Vote and Board Elections

2pm - 9pm

June 15, 2021 Budget Revote if Necessary



Budget Voting

- » Vote at Bennett, Phoenicia and Woodstock schools from 2 – 9pm
- » Eligible voters can vote in any of the three buildings
- » West Hurley Fire House will not be a polling location
- » Absentee Ballots are available for those that do not want to vote in person
